- 2.50 Bontoc tribesmen do their traditional dance aided by Crosby junior. (Note:Bontoc is the capital of Mountain Province. RW Crosby later became President and Chairman of Benguet Corporation.)
- 4.37 Singapore traffic cop. Rickshas. Lightering. Junks etc.
- 6.20 Panorama of Raub Australian Gold Mine. Miners descending main shaft. Some women workers. (Note: Interesting method of lifting water. At Pahang on the Malay Peninsular, Raub was an Australian company managed by Dr. W. Penseler. It had a 60 head stamp battery, an Edwards Roaster and a Merrill-Crowe plant.)
- 8.10 Motor ferry Malaya
- 8.58 Malaya. The cool drink merchant.
- 9.09 Off to Java and Sumatra. D.E.I. (Note: Dutch East Indies)
- 9.16 Bandeong Java street scene. Government administrative buildings. Mr Holleman chief of mines department.
  - (Note: W Holleman and his wife were Dutch. They returned to The Hague where he died during the war. Their son Rochus Holleman served in the Dutch airforce and married Ida Lucy Browne of St Kilda (Melbourne) in late November 1946.)
